Medical Assisting Program

In this entry-level course, Medical Assistants can gain the knowledge, skills, and competencies to prepare a student to become a Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA), Certified Phlebotomy Technician (CPT), and Certified EKG Technician (CET). The 384 hour course includes topics: Critical Thinking, EKG, Medical Law & Ethics, Anatomy and Physiology, Medical Terminology, Administrative Procedures, Pharmacology and Administration of Medications, and Phlebotomy.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS:

STUDENTS MUST TURN IN AN APPLICATION TO THE CONTINUING EDUCATION OFFICE

- Minimum age 18 and no criminal convictions or probation
- Have no physical restrictions and be able to lift and move patients
- Competent communication skills (speaking, reading, & writing) / Instruction provided in English
- Current Shot Records as required by the Department of State Health Services <u>at the time of enrollment</u> MMR (2); Tetanus (<10 years); Varicella (2); and Hepatitis B Series (3)
- Copy of high school transcript (with graduation date), high school diploma, or GED scores
- Proof of CPR certification prior to program beginning
- Attendance is mandatory
- Clinical: scrubs, shoes & watch (with a second hand) required when Clinical begins. Picture name tag; you will be notified in class when pictures will be taken and when Clinical will begin

** IMPORTANT **

Medical Assisting Application, complete shot record, copy of social security card and state identification, and proof of high school completion must be turned in by October 2, 2024 by 5 pm.

Upon acceptance, Registration and FULL payment must be completed by October 21st by 5 pm.
